Members of the Colorado State Patrol play an essential role in every Coloradoan's life, every day. Whether responding to a traffic accident or instructing teens on safe driving habits, they are a large and integral part of Colorado's safety. Periodically in the course of serving our security, these men and women lose their lives, devastating the families they leave behind.

In the tragic event that a Colorado State Trooper is killed in the line of duty, **The Colorado State Patrol Family Foundation has pledged to help these families re-build after their loss through financial and educational assistance and emotional support.** The CSPFF operates as a benevolent fund for ACSPP Members. It established this Fallen Officers Fund to ensure to its a college education to the surviving dependents of the fallen officer. The success of this Fund has been very satisfying for the CSPFF in that several fallen officers' children have already received such an education.

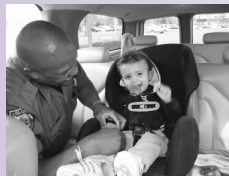
Hardship & Support

In addition, CSPFF awards college scholarships to ACSPP members and their families on an annual basis to assist them in the furtherance of their education. Also in keeping

with the mission of the Colorado State Patrol, the CSPFF has expanded its services to include a variety of educational programs to serve the general public as well. Such community involvement includes the Alive at 25 Defensive Driving Program, Child Passenger Safety Colorado, and recently, supporting and promoting a ground-floor operation in conjunction with the Colorado State Patrol, the Colorado State Patrol Alumni Association, and The Association of Colorado State Patrol Professionals to craft a Colorado State Patrol History Museum and Learning Center.
